Weekend Discussion Questions

January 1-2, 2011

Community:

1. Do you have a favorite murder mystery movie or TV show?
2. What is about the genre that fascinates you, if anything?

Core:

1. What are your thoughts on darkness? Were you ever (or are you now) afraid of the dark?
2. Can you think of things in your life that you already suspect are leading you down a dark path that could be “killers” in your life?
3. Read John 1:4-5. What does it mean to have Jesus shine into our darkness?
4. How has Jesus’ light shone and changed you from what you were before?
5. What are some things you do to give Jesus access to shine His light in your life?
6. Jim said our relationship with God will always be proportional to how much access we give Him to all the areas of our life. What areas seem to be the hardest to give God access?
7. If we know that Jesus’ light is good, why is it so hard to give Him access to everything?
8. Read Proverbs 4:12. What are some ways that “seem right” but can lead to death?
9. How do these lead to death...in our relationship to God...our marriages...our friendships?
10. Read John 10:10. Who is “the enemy” that Jesus is mentioning here and how does he “steal and kill and destroy”?
11. Are you looking for God’s truth for your life?
12. Are you open to the idea that God’s truth might be different than what you thought or hoped it might be?
13. Read John 8:31-32. What does Jesus say we need to do in order to know the truth and be set free?

Challenge:

1. Take the time this week to pray and ask God which areas of your life need the most light. Then, have faith and act upon it. Let God have access to EVERY part of your life.
2. Memorize Proverbs 4:12—*“There is a way that seems right to a man, but in the end leads to death.”*
